


Minnesota Public Facilities Authority

- The Public Facilities Authority (PFA) is a multi-agency financing authority that provides municipal financing expertise and infrastructure financing programs to enhance the environmental and economic vitality of the State.
- The PFA is an independent agency governed by a board consisting of six state commissioners representing the departments of Employment and Economic Development, Management and Budget, Health, Agriculture, Transportation, and the Pollution Control Agency.
- The PFA manages the investments and transactions of three revolving loan funds and several other grant and loan programs in conjunction with member agencies of the PFA board.
 - Partner agencies/departments set project priorities, conduct technical and environmental reviews, certify approved projects to PFA for funding
 - PFA staff conduct credit reviews, set loan terms and conditions, service loans, and provide overall financial and program administration
 - PFA staff also assist local governments to understand the various financing programs and requirements
- PFA has statutory authority to sell up to \$1.5 billion in tax-exempt revenue bonds.
 - PFA clean water and drinking water bonds are rated AAA by all three major rating agencies
 - Bonds repaid from loan repayments and investment earnings (no state backing)
 - Current bonds outstanding: \$1.1 billion
 - Total assets of \$2.0 billion
- PFA administrative expenses are less than 1% of total financing provided.
 - PFA has 10 FTEs; DEED provides some administrative support functions
 - PFA receives no state general funds for program administration. Admin funds come from set-asides from federal funds and fees on loan repayments which are statutorily appropriated
- PFA also provides funds to the Pollution Control Agency and Health Department for their expenses to administer the Clean Water and Drinking Water Revolving Funds.



Clean Water Infrastructure Financing Programs

Note: All PFA clean water programs follow the Pollution Control Agency's Project Priority List which ranks projects based on environmental and public health criteria.

BASE PROGRAMS

Clean Water Revolving Fund

- Low interest loans for municipal wastewater and stormwater projects.
 - Total loans, 1989 to date: 401 loans for \$2.3 billion
 - Interest savings to local govts/taxpayers: \$526 million
 - FY 2010: 30 loans (50 projects) for \$271 million, average rate: 2.5%
- PFA leverages federal and state seed funds by issuing AAA rated revenue bonds to generate additional loan funds to address large and growing needs
 - Since the beginning of the program, each \$1 of state funds has generated over \$15 in construction and over \$3 in interest savings for local governments
- PFA has also allocated \$84.9 million to capitalize nonpoint source loan programs administered by other agencies (MDA's AgBMP Program and MPCA's CWP Program), resulting in more than \$178 million in loans to landowners to implement more than 15,000 best management practices to reduce water pollution from nonpoint sources
- 2010 bonding bill appropriated \$19.2 million to provide required 20% match for expected 2011-2012 federal funds
- 2010 federal funds require \$5.6 million to be provided as principal forgiveness (grants)
 - \$3.7 million will be used to address affordability needs based on same criteria as WIF; balance for stormwater, water conservation and energy efficiency projects

Wastewater Infrastructure Funding (WIF) Program

- Supplemental assistance for high cost wastewater projects to address existing needs
- Program is accessed in one of two ways:
 - For projects eligible to receive grants/loans from USDA Rural Development, WIF provides grant match for up to 65% of grant need based on RD eligibility criteria
 - For non-RD projects, WIF provides a grant to package with CWRF loans. WIF grants equal 80% of average residential wastewater system cost over 1.4% of median household income (approx. \$45/month for average non-metro MHI).
 - Maximum grant is \$4 million
- 2010 bonding bill appropriated \$24.2 million for WIF program. All funds committed to projects that have or will start construction in 2010-2011

CLEAN WATER FUND PROGRAMS

Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Grant Program

- Grants to assist municipalities to implement wastewater and stormwater projects to comply with wasteload reductions needed to meet TMDL requirements
- Grants for 50% of eligible costs, up to \$3 million
- Needs are expected to increase significantly as more TMDL studies are approved
- 2009 Clean Water Fund appropriation: FY 2010 - \$8,816,000; FY 2011 - \$12,834,000.
 - FY 2010 projects funded: 14 projects, \$9,375,965
 - FY 2011 applications: 23 projects, \$26 million estimated grant need

Phosphorus Reduction Grant Program

- Grants to assist municipalities to meet additional capital costs to reduce discharge of total phosphorus to 1 milligram per liter or less
- Grants for 50% of eligible costs, up to \$500,000
- 2009 Clean Water Fund appropriation: FY 2010 - \$4,125,000; FY 2011 - \$4,425,000.
 - FY 2010 projects funded: 8 projects, \$3,284,378
 - FY 2011 applications: 12 projects, \$3.5 million estimated grant need

Small Community Wastewater Treatment Program

- Loans and grants to assist small communities to replace non-complying septic systems with new individual and cluster subsurface sewage treatment systems (SSTS) that will be publicly owned and operated
- Technical assistance grants up to \$40,000 to contract with consultants and licensed SSTS professionals for feasibility studies and technical assistance
- Construction financing up to \$500,000 per year through 1% loans, with 50% grants if below average MHI
- 2009 Clean Water Fund appropriation: FY 2010 - \$500,000; FY 2011 - \$2,000,000
- Projects:
 - Technical assistance grants
 - active: 14 projects, \$379,500
 - completed: 8 projects, \$196,200
 - Construction loans/grants
 - active: 2 projects, \$411,023
 - completed: 1 project, \$304,773




Fees: up to 2% of the loan repayment is deposited as a fee for administrative costs. This amount is part of the required loan interest repayment, not an additional charge to the borrower.

Revenue / Debt Service Account balance: accumulating for the next revenue bond debt service payments.



Drinking Water Revolving Fund


- The Drinking Water Revolving Fund program follows priorities set by the Health Department's Project Priority List which ranks projects based on public health criteria.
- The DWRF program provides low interest loans for municipal drinking water projects, including new or improved drinking water treatment plants, wells, water towers, and transmission lines.
 - Total loans, 1989 to date: 280 loans for \$583 million
 - Interest savings to local govt/taxpayers: \$118 million
 - FY 2010:
 - 40 loans (52 projects) for \$88.2 million, average rate: 2.2%
 - 28 awards of federal principal forgiveness for \$17.8 million
- PFA leverages federal and state seed funds by issuing AAA rated revenue bonds to generate additional loan funds based on demand.
 - Since the beginning of the program, each \$1 of state funds has generated over \$12 in construction and over \$2 in interest savings for local governments.
- 2010 bonding bill appropriated \$12.8 million to provide required 20% match for expected 2011-2012 federal funds.
- 2010 federal appropriation required a portion of the funds to be provided as principal forgiveness (grants).
 - \$7.0 million was used to assist communities with high priority projects that met affordability criteria in state law
 - \$1.7 million will be used for stormwater, water conservation and energy efficiency projects in 2011.
- Under the set-aside provisions of the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, the PFA also provides DWRF funds to the Health Department for wellhead protection, public water supply supervision, and technical assistance.







Transportation Revolving Loan Fund

- Low interest loans to governmental entities for eligible transportation projects, including road, bridge, and transit projects.
 - Total loans from 1999 to date: 30 loans for \$149 million
 - Interest savings to borrowers/taxpayers: \$21.8 million
 - FY 2010: 2 loans for \$2.8 million

Credit Enhancement Program

- Provides limited state guarantee of local government general obligation bonds issued for certain purposes, allowing issuers to receive higher bond ratings, thereby reducing interest costs.
- Eligible county projects include construction of jails, correctional facilities, law enforcement facilities, and social/human service facilities.
- Eligible city projects include wastewater, drinking water, and stormwater facilities.
- If the issuer is unable to make a bond payment the state will make the payment, provided funds are available in the general fund, and the issuer is pledged to repay the state, with interest.
- Total debt liability capped at \$1 billion
- Program to date has provided \$6.3 million savings to counties and \$6.1 million savings to cities with no expenditure of state funds.
- Current participation
 - Counties: 58 bond issues for \$386 million
 - Cities: 72 bond issues for \$153 million
