<b>Capital project replacement accounts</b>	HF 3582, amended	Requires grantees of a direct appropriation or grant of state money for a capital project to establish a capital project replacement fund for future capital improvements to the project.	16

<b>Uncollectible debt</b>	HF 4815	Modifies the date of a required legislative report related to state debt determined to be uncollectible.	24

<b>Board of AELSLAGID</b>	HF 3606	Requires that the Board of Architecture, Engineering, Land Surveying, Landscape Architecture, Geoscience, and Interior Design (AELSLAGID) send a notice by email to each license or certificate holder, no later than 30 days prior to expiration of the license or certificate.	44

<b>Uniform Commercial Code Account</b>	N/A	Amends the permissible uses of the Uniform Commercial Code account in the state treasury. This account is used by the secretary of state for a variety of purposes related to the central filing system required for business filings, retrieval, and payment method services.	45
<b>Notaries public</b>	HF 4972	Amends laws governing notarial acts, including the authority to perform notarial acts on electronic records, and an allowance for an existing notarial stamp to continue to be used in the event requirements for the stamp are changed.	46-49
<b>Federal education law implementation report</b>	HF 4798	Repeals a requirement that the commissioner of management and budget report the amount of federal revenue that the federal government could withhold if the state decided to stop implementing the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA).	51

<b>Hennepin County; set-aside contracts</b>	HF4339, as amended by H4339A1	<p>Authorizes Hennepin County to award set-aside contracts to businesses and social services organizations that employ individuals eligible for public assistance or who would require rehabilitative services in the absence of their employment even though the businesses or organizations do not meet the threshold of half or more of the employees meeting the criteria.</p> <p>A vendor providing construction services that does not have at least 50 percent of its employees that meet the public assistance or rehabilitative services criteria must have as many employees that meet the criteria as is practicable, taking into consideration industry safety standards, established supervisory ratios for apprentices, and requirements for licensed persons to perform certain work.</p> <p>Technical amendments are made throughout.</p>	1
<b>Anoka County; jail and criminal justice center</b>	HF 3346	Authorizes Anoka County to build a jail and criminal justice center in any city in the county to replace the current jail in the city of Anoka. Also authorizes the sheriff to keep an office in the new jail and criminal justice center. Effective the day following final enactment.	2

<b>Repealer</b>	HF3345, HF4515	<p>Paragraph (a) repeals a statute codified in 2017 that provides all merchants in the state with the option to provide customers a paper, plastic, or reusable bag for packaging purchased items or goods. The statute also prohibits a political subdivision from imposing a ban on merchant bags. The repeal of the language is effective the day following final enactment.</p> <p>Paragraph (b) repeals a 1979 special law that phased out the imposition and collection by the city of St. Paul of a franchise fee from a public utility based on residential gas or electricity sales in the winter months (November through April). The repeal is effective the day after the governing body of the city of St. Paul and its chief clerical officer timely complete their compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 645.021, subdivisions 2 and 3.</p>	3
