

About Scandia

- First Swedish settlement in MN
- Monument to first Swedish settlers erected in 1900
- Gammelgarden Museum honors Swedish immigrant history – about 3000 int'l visitors per year
- Two Scandia buildings on National Registry of Historic Places (Hay Lake School and Erickson settler's cabin) and two seeking placement.





Regional Significance

- William O'Brien State Park Scandia
 - -Over 200,000 visitors/year
 - -A top camped state park
 - -Gateway Trail will link to Village Center
- Big Marine Park Preserve just south of Scandia
- **Swedish Immigrant Regional Trail** just north in Chisago County
- National Park Service seeking to designate St.
 Croix River region a National Heritage Area




