On behalf of the 135 organizational members of the Minnesota Asset Building Coalition (MABC), thank you so much for including an appropriation for the Getting to Work Grant Program in your omnibus budget bills. We're grateful to the bill authors, Senator Hawj and Representative Koegel, for championing this legislation and to the committees for recognizing the value of the Getting to Work program.

Getting to Work is a competitive grant program housed at DEED that connects low-income workers with jobs by funding nonprofit organizations that help workers in their communities overcome transportation barriers.

A reliable vehicle is critical to the success of most working families. Between legislative sessions each year, MABC staff visit nonprofit organizations across the state to better understand the challenges facing their communities and hear about the priorities they believe MABC should include in our legislative agenda. Nearly every MABC member raises the issue of transportation barriers and asks that MABC prioritize Getting to Work.

DEED has done a great job of ensuring that Getting to Work grants fund transportation programs all across the state. See the reverse side of this letter for a list of Getting to Work grant recipients.

In 2022, a Star Tribune article profiled Getting to Work and highlighted the program's statewide impact.

<u>DEED's legislative report</u> on Getting to Work grants includes specific examples of individuals and families whose income increased and whose families benefitted from having reliable transportation.
