





User Financing (UF)

Minnesota Statute 16A.662 *Infrastructure Development Bonds*.

Subd 5. ...the commissioner of management and budget shall assess each higher education system for one-third the amount that would otherwise need to be transferred with respect to those bonds sold to finance capital improvement projects at institutions under the control of the system...

General application:

- Applicable to individual college and university projects
- Does NOT apply to asset preservation (HEAPR) funding



User Financing (UF)

Minnesota State application:

- One-half of the UF amount is paid by the system (state appropriations)
- One-half of the UF amount is paid by the gaining institution from their general operating funds (state appropriations and tuition revenues)

Example: Total project funding = \$9.0 million

- State financing (GO) = \$6.0 million
- User Financing (UF) = \$3.0 million
 - \$1.5 million serviced by Minnesota State system
 - \$1.5 million serviced by the gaining college or university

User Financing (UF)

Current Minnesota State position:

- \$171.8 million in outstanding UF debt from previously funded projects
- \$27.0 million debt service paid in FY2022

Impacts:

- Total annual debt service represents roughly 1.9% of college and university state appropriation and tuition revenues.
- Ranges:

Colleges: 0.7% - 3.2% Universities: 1.0% - 2.7%

2023 Capital Investment Request

- Total User Financing (UF) = \$58.3 million
- Estimated annual debt service = \$1.4 million
