What is "Charitable Gambling"?

- paddlewheels
- raffles
- primarily in bars and clubs

What isn't "Charitable Gambling"?

- the Lottery
- Tribal casinos
- horse racing

Why is it called "charitable" gambling?

- all the gambling activity is run by charities and nonprofits
 - by 1100+ licensed nonprofits
 - at 3000+ sites
- the proceeds are required—by law—to support charitable causes

How large was the **industry** last year?

- \$4.9 billion in sales
- \$4.3 billion in prizes
- \$170 million in tax revenue
- \$140 million supporting charitable causes

What is the **Gambling Control Board**?

- a seven-member citizen Board
- a staff of 50
- a budget of \$6 million (that comes from regulatory fees)
- four regional offices
- responsibilities include:
 - Site inspections
 - Compliance reviews
 - Licensing restrictions
 - Investigations
 - Education and outreach
