Dear Senator Koran and Representative Baker,

I write to support the bill SF 254/HF 471 to establish alternative substance use disorder licensing inspections. NUWAY<sup>®</sup> is a co-occurring substance use disorder treatment provider who in 2019 was accredited by The Joint Commission (TJC).
