

1.1 Swedzinski from the Committee on Energy Finance and Policy to which was referred:

1.2 H. F. No. 9, A bill for an act relating to energy; modifying the hydroelectric capacity
1.3 that qualifies as an eligible energy technology under the renewable energy standard; delaying
1.4 the requirement for electric utilities to meet the renewable energy, solar, or carbon-free
1.5 standard under certain conditions; prohibiting the demolition of fossil-fuel-powered electric
1.6 generating plants under certain conditions; declaring as state policy support for the
1.7 deployment of carbon capture and sequestration technologies as a means to reduce greenhouse
1.8 gas emissions; abolishing prohibition on issuing certificate of need for new nuclear power
1.9 plant; expanding the sales tax exemption for residential heating fuels and electricity;
1.10 amending Minnesota Statutes 2024, sections 216B.1691, subdivisions 1, 2b; 216B.243,
1.11 subdivision 3b; 297A.67, subdivision 15; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota
1.12 Statutes, chapters 216B; 216H.

1.13 Reported the same back with the recommendation that the bill be re-referred to the
1.14 Committee on Taxes.
