1.3 H. F. No. 2358, A bill for an act relating to public safety; providing enhanced criminal
1.4 penalty for certain violations of coercion crime that proximately cause great bodily harm
1.5 or death of victim; providing for public awareness campaign; amending Minnesota Statutes
1.6 2024, section 609.27, subdivision 2.

1.7 Reported the same back with the following amendments:

1.8 Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

1.9 "Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 609.27, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

1.10 Subd. 2. **Sentence.** (a) Whoever violates subdivision 1 may be sentenced as follows:

1.11 (1) to imprisonment for not more than 90 days or to payment of a fine of not more than
1.12 \$1,000, or both if neither the pecuniary gain received by the violator nor the loss suffered
1.13 by the person threatened or another as a result of the threat exceeds \$300, or the benefits
1.14 received or harm sustained are not susceptible of pecuniary measurement; or

1.15 (2) to imprisonment for not more than five years or to payment of a fine of not more
1.16 than \$10,000, or both, if such pecuniary gain or loss is more than \$300 but less than \$2,500;
1.17 or

1.18 (3) to imprisonment for not more than ten years or to payment of a fine of not more than
1.19 \$20,000, or both, if such pecuniary gain or loss is \$2,500, or more.

1.20 (b) A person who violates subdivision 1, clause (6), may be sentenced to imprisonment
1.21 for not more than ten years, or to payment of a fine of not more than \$20,000, or both, if
1.22 the violation is a substantial factor in the victim suffering great bodily harm.

1.23 (c) A person who violates subdivision 1, clause (6), may be sentenced to imprisonment
1.24 for not more than 15 years, or to payment of a fine of not more than \$30,000, or both, if the
1.25 violation is a substantial factor in the victim suffering death.

2.1 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2026, and applies to crimes
2.2 committed on or after that date."
