RE: Support for Library Construction Grants

Dear Representative Murphy,

On behalf of the Minnesota Library Association, I am writing to thank you for your strong support and advocacy for public libraries. In particular, we would like to thank you for your strong support of the Library Construction Grant program over the years. As you are aware, public library buildings are a vital part of a community's social infrastructure. Your continued support of bonding dollars for construction and remodeling of public library buildings through the State's authorized matching program will help ensure that all Minnesotans have access to safe, accessible and welcoming library spaces.

Since 1995, over 150 library projects have benefitted from this program. Grants ranging from \$3,000 to \$1M allowed for the renovation of current spaces, provided ADA accessibility, and completed new construction projects. Recent projects include:

- The expansion of the Fergus Falls Public Library, which received \$1M in grant funds of the \$8M total project costs. This expansion resulted in advanced technology access for the community, enhanced areas for youth and improved community meeting rooms and gathering spaces.
- In 2019, the community of Kimball was awarded just under \$500K for a new library which will replace an outdated, century-old location. With only 800 square feet, the previous location lacked space for high-demand collections and public computer stations, and most importantly accessibility. Thanks to the construction grant and the more than 250 individuals, businesses and organizations who raised the funds for the matching grant, the new 4,000 square foot building will provide the necessary services including a community room available to the public beyond library open hours to better serve the community for decades to come.

Because the need is great, and because investing in library infrastructure means investing in Minnesota's communities, the Minnesota Library Association strongly urges the House Capital Investment Division to provide funding at the highest level of support.
