## Summary

As amended, this bill modifies Amara's Law by delaying (from January 1, 2026, to July 1, 2027) when manufacturers of products containing intentionally added PFAS must submit to the Pollution Control Agency (PCA) certain information, including the purpose for and amount of the PFAS added to the product. Under current law, the PCA may waive these requirements under certain circumstances and may extend the deadline if it determines more time is needed to comply.

Amara's Law was passed in 2023 and banned 11 categories of products from containing intentionally added PFAS beginning January 1, 2025, and all products beginning January 1, 2032, with certain exemptions. It also established certain requirements for manufacturers, including the information submission requirements.
