1.18 Subd. 3. Seasonal load restrictions; exemption. (a) The seasonal load restrictions under

1.19 section 169.87, subdivisions 1 and 2, do not apply to a towing or recovery vehicle that does

- 1.20 not exceed a weight of 20,000 pounds per single axle, and is being operated for the purpose
- 1.21 of towing or recovering another vehicle that:
- 1.22 (1) is located within a public road right-of-way and was either involved in a vehicle
- 1.23 crash or is inoperable; or

2.1	(2) has entered a public body of water adjacent to the roadway.
2.2	(b) The exemption under this subdivision only applies when a request has been made
2.3	by a federal, state, or local law enforcement agency for a tow truck or recovery vehicle to
2.4	move a vehicle specified in paragraph (a).
2.5	(c) As used in this section, recovery vehicle means a vehicle equipped with a boom that
2.6	is used to move or recover an inoperable vehicle. A recovery vehicle also includes a tow
