

# Minnesota Clean Water, Land and Legacy



Minnesota voters passed the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment to the Minnesota Constitution in 2008. The Legacy Amendment is funded from a threeeighths of one percent increase to the state sales tax with revenue dedicated to:

- protect, enhance, and restore water quality in lakes, rivers, and streams, groundwater from degradation, and to protect drinking water sources;
- 2. restore, protect, and enhance wetlands, prairies, forest and habitat for fish, game, and wildlife;
- support arts, arts education and arts access, and to preserve Minnesota's history and cultural heritage;
- 4. support parks and trails of regional or statewide significance.


# VISION: In 2035, our world-class parks and trails connect everyone to the outdoors...



# Metro region Legacy distribution

State statute allocates funding for metropolitan regional park implementing agencies.


- 90% distributed noncompetitively by legislative formula
- 10% dedicated for land acquisition, distributed on a first-come-first-served basis.
  - Met Council matches acquisition funds \$2 for every \$3





# Metro region project selection process

- Projects selected by each of the 10 locally elected boards or commissions
- Projects reviewed by Met Council
  - Consistency with park and trail plans
  - Consistency with all state guidelines and requirements

### **State Parks and Trails System**

#### **State Parks and Recreation Areas**

- 73 State Parks and Recreation Areas
- 5,000 camping and lodging units
- 240,000 acres of land managed, including critical habitat for the state's threatened/endangered species and cultural resources of statewide significance.

#### **State Forest Recreation Areas**


- 43 state forest campgrounds
- 12 state forest horse campgrounds
- 29 forest day-use areas

#### State and Grant-in-Aid (GIA) Trails

- 25 state trails
- 1,500 miles of developed state trails
   2,700 are designated
- 24,600 miles of Grant-in-aid trails

#### **Water Recreation**

- 35 state water trails
- 1,700 public water accesses
- 390 fishing piers





A Parks and Trails Legacy investment has gone towards adding a new trail segment dedicated for bicyclists in **Itasca State Park.** This provides safer recreational transportation opportunities for visitors and eliminate a 3-mile shared use segment on Wilderness Drive.



### **State Parks and Trails** Acquire Land, Create Opportunities



The Parks and Trails Legacy Fund provided \$8 million dollars to develop Shipwreck Creek Campground to meet camping demands in the popular area.

Prior to this project, the only camping offered at **Split Rock Lighthouse State Park** were limited cart-in or walk-in camping opportunities



### **State Parks and Trails** Take Care of What We Have



Vault toilets at **Sibley State Park's** Lakeview Campground provide family-friendly year-round facilities to the public.

Nearby is the historic Veteran's Conservation Corps building, renovated to be used as a shower building.








Complete Concept Evaluation Determinating Designation Status

**Funding Application** Designated Facilities Apply for Annual Legacy Funding

- Application reviewed by 5-member Evaluation Team and ranked High, Medium or Low. High ranked applications are invited to submit a qualified Master Plan
- Staff review plan for completeness and eligibility and conduct a site visit of the facility. Evaluation Team review of the Master Plan and criteria scoring. Commissioners review and deliberation for regional designation.
- Annual funding applications are submitted for regionally impactful components as described in the Master Plan. Staff conduct site visits and score applications based on established criteria. Commissioners review, comment and determine priority list.


### Natural Resource Based Parks

Provide a high quality outdoor recreational opportunities in a natural and scenic setting.



### Trails

Provide high quality recreational trail experiences that are readily accessible from an already populated or growing regional center or tourism destination.





### **Special Features**

Relates to new, unique or innovative "special feature" outdoor recreational facilities of regional significance.








### Supportive Partnership - New

Regional quality city and county facilities that support large, diverse key recreation resources that are owned or controlled by non-eligible entities or units of government, such as federal, state, or nonprofit organizations.
