Overview

This bill prohibits the Minnesota Department of Human Rights from maintaining a database of incidents related to speech, including the press, assembly, and right of association. This bill also requires the commissioner of the Human Rights Department work with the commissioner of labor and industry, on discrimination complaints from Uber and Lyft drivers.

Summary

Section Description

1 Formulation of policies.

Prohibits the commissioner of the Department of Human Rights from collecting data or creating a database of incidents of protected speech, or from offering a reward for the reporting of incidents of protected speech.

Protected speech includes the exercise of free speech under the constitution, the right to publish speech, to assemble or petition, and the right of association as guaranteed by the U.S. and state Constitutions.

Requires the commissioner of the Human Rights Department to work with the commissioner of labor and industry, on the complaints from Uber and Lyft drivers of discrimination.
