Overview

This bill specifies an area where Duluth would be allowed to establish redevelopment districts operating under special rules exempting the districts from certain general law requirements.

Summary

Section Description

1 City of Duluth; tax increment financing district; special rules.

Subd. 1. Establishment. Allows Duluth to establish redevelopment districts in specified parcels and allows the districts to follow the special rules in subdivision 2.

Subd. 2. Special rules.

- Exempts the districts from the general law requirement that redevelopment districts only be established in blighted areas;
- exempts the districts from the general law requirement that 90 percent of
 TIF revenue from redevelopment districts be used to correct blight;
- exempts the districts from the prohibition on using increment either for public parks or for facilities used for social, recreational, or conference purposes;
- exempts the districts from the prohibition on an authority's acquiring more than 25 percent of the acreage in a project using TIF bonds proceeds when the property's increment is pledged to pay off the bonds;
- exempts the district from limitations on spending increment outside of the district;
- exempts the districts from rules requiring that in-district development debt be undertaken within five years of certification of the original net tax capacity; and

Section Description

 exempts the districts from rules requiring that, at the expiration of the five-year rule period, the in-district percentage of increment be spent on paying down in-district development debt.

Subd. 3. Expiration. Expires the special rules under subdivision 2 on December 31, 2051, and requires that unspent or unobligated increment thereafter be spent to pay off in-district development debt.
