# **Governor Recommends:** \$624,000 in FY22 and ongoing



ILR covers costs for entities that do not directly pay for their leased spaces including:

- State Capitol Building
  - House and Senate spaces
  - Ceremonial spaces
- State Office Building
- Governor's Residence
- Monuments and memorials
- Revisor of Statutes and Legislative Reference Library
- Veterans Service Organizations

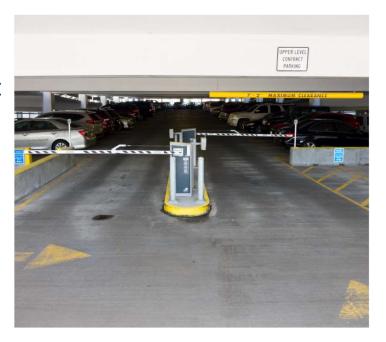


#### **Capitol Complex Parking Fund Shortfall**

# **Governor Recommends:** \$993,000 transfer waiver in FY21 & FY22



- The Parking Fund Shortfall is a result of:
  - Contract cancellations
  - Decreased meter usage
- Parking facility expenses are funded by user fees



#### **Operating Adjustment**

# Governor Recommends: \$335,000 in FY22 and \$561,000 in FY23 and ongoing



- This includes a holdback of \$-300,000 in FY21
- These changes will allow Admin to maintain the current level of service delivery that Minnesotan's expect
- Increase is below inflation and acknowledges efficiencies achieved by Admin
- Change will help fund compensation, rent, and IT



# Enterprise Planning, Space Consolidation, and Relocation

## *Governor Recommends:* \$5,000,000 in FY21



The change will fund:

- a statutorily required Real Estate Strategic Plan
- Agency space consolidation and reconfiguration
- Agency relocation

Helps Admin assist agencies to reconfigure their space so they can make the best choices for the state.



#### **Grants Administration Support**

## **Governor Recommends:**No additional funding



Allow agencies to retain funds for administration:

- Up to 5% of new legislatively-named or formula grants
- Up to 10% of competitive grants
