

OUR UNIQUE ROLES

- ARTS HIGH SCHOOL
 - 11TH AND 12TH GRADE RESIDENTIAL ARTS HIGH SCHOOL
 - STUDENTS ATTEND FROM ALL OVER THE STATE (CURRENTLY 33 OF 87 COUNTIES REPRESENTED)
- PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT & RESOURCE PROGRAMS (PDR)

ASSET PRESERVATION (\$4,000,000)

- TO PRESERVE EXISTING INFRASTRUCTURE
- TO REFLECT PERPICH STRATEGIC PLAN
- POTENTIAL OPERATING BUDGET SAVINGS IN ENERGY COST SAVINGS AND REPEATED REPAIR COSTS
- ADDRESS ABOUT 50% OF THE AGENCY'S DEFERRED MAINTENANCE BACKLOG
- PREVIOUS ASSET PRESERVATION AMOUNTS
 - **2014 \$2,000,000**
 - 2018 \$250,000
 - 2020 \$750,000

- REPAIR/REPLACE EXTERIOR PRECAST CONCRETE PANELS
- REPLACE THE ROOF
- THIS SAME WORK WAS CONDUCTED ON OUR DORMITORY IN 2018 USING CAPRA FUNDS.

RESTROOM UPDATES

- RESTROOM STUDY CONDUCTED IN 2016 FINDINGS
 - BUILDING CODE COMPLIANCE ISSUES RESTROOM DOORS NON-COMPLIANT
 - ADA CODE COMPLIANCE ADDITIONAL STALLS/FIXTURES/ACCESSORIES NEEDED
 - ADDITIONAL FIXTURES NEEDED IN A BUILDING THIS SIZE 44 FIXTURES REQUIRED, CURRENT ONLY 33

CAMPUS SIDEWALKS

- REPLACE SIDEWALKS AROUND THE CAMPUS
- SIDEWALKS CRACKED AND BROKEN ARE POSING SAFETY HAZARD
- NEGATIVE PUBLIC APPEARANCE

ASSET PRESERVATION (\$4,000,000)







SCHOOL BUILDING WORK PREDESIGN

- REQUESTED TO ADDRESS SAFETY AND SECURITY OF STUDENTS AND STAFF
 - A 2018 SECURITY ASSESSMENT NOTED SEVERAL RECOMMENDATIONS
 - **a)** Move security office to the front entryway
 - REDESIGN FRONT ENTRYWAY TO BETTER CONTROL TRAFFIC FLOW INTO THE BUILDING
 - C REINFORCING ENTRY/EXIT DOORS WITH BOLLARDS OR EQUIVALENT
 - INSTALL A "HARDENED" RECEPTION AREA
- TO ADDRESS ADA CONCERNS WITH THE HANDICAP LIFT
 - CURRENTLY THE LIFT ONLY GOES TO THE 2ND FLOOR

- PERFORMANCE HALL/AUDITORIUM EXPANSION
 - A SPACE IS NEEDED TO HOLD THE ENTIRE STUDENT BODY AND STAFF
