Disfluency is a direct result of Deaf children not having access to language, specifically ASL. It is well known that the resources we have access to as children have a lasting impact on our ability to thrive as adults. Deaf children have fallen through the cracks without the explicit language of the law to support them. Language equity is long overdue. Our community, state and nation will be so much stronger with full support and resources given to ALL children.
