## **Overview**

The Minnesota Indian Scholarship program (MISP) awards need-based scholarships up to a specified maximum amount to state residents who attend Minnesota postsecondary institutions and are either (a) one-fourth or more Indian ancestry, or (b) an enrolled member or citizen of a federally recognized American Indian or Canadian First Nations tribe. This bill makes changes to one of the program's eligibility requirements, increases award maximums, and appropriates a to-be-determined amount of supplemental funding for the program.

# Summary

### **Section Description**

## 1 Student eligibility.

Removes the requirement that undergraduate students must be eligible for a Pell grant or state grant in order to receive an Indian scholarship.

#### 2 Award amount.

Increases the maximum award amount for undergraduate students from \$4,000 to \$8,000 per academic year. Increases the maximum award amount for graduate students from \$6,000 to \$8,000 per academic year.

#### 3 America Indian scholarships.

Amends the fiscal year 2023 appropriation for MISP. The amount is to-bedetermined.
