- Part of tourism economy








Mission

Partner with communities and organizations to seek, acknowledge, elevate, and share hidden histories, diverse stories, and non-traditional expertise.









Historic Sites Network

- Statewide Presence of History Where It Happened
- Defined in statutes in M.S. 138.662
- Includes many of the state's most significant historic sites, including 140+ structures for which MNHS is responsible
- Important part of tourism economy -many out-of-state visitors
- Educational and affordable destination for families and school groups





The Minnesota Historical Society holds for the people of Minnesota, current and future generations:

- 340,394 photographs
- 502,499 publications
- 6,556 works of art
- 251,790 objects
- 50,800 cubic feet of manuscripts
- 60,500 cubic feet in State Archives, including 100 terabytes of digital records





Number of People Served (pre-pandemic)

- Nearly one million in-person visits to historic sites and museums
- Includes nearly 200,000 schoolchildren on organized programs to historic sites and museums
- Over 5 million visits to the Society's website www.mnhs.org





Statewide History Involvement and Participation


- 27,000 participants in History Day (many national award winners from Minnesota)
- 15,200 Members
- Volunteers make this all happen!
 - o Over 2,500 volunteers and interns contributing 71,000 hours and equivalent to 26 FTE.






FY 2023 Budget (All Funds)

MNHS - 2023 Session Budget Request Operating Budget


Base budget: \$23.9 million each year – General Fund
