Written Testimony in Support of ERA SF37

Human rights are given to humans. We begin with some easy questions – are men human? Are women human? Obviously.

What about gay people, nonbinary people, pregnant women, disabled individuals, and transgender people – are they human? The answer *should be* obvious.

Human rights are afforded to humans which encompasses: people from all socioeconomic statuses, all political beliefs, and all religions; minority groups; members of all races; disabled people; the young and the old; working professionals and stay-at-home mothers; men and women born as such; men and women who identify as such; women who want to become pregnant; women who do not want to be, or become pregnant; and women who are pregnant.

Human rights are afforded – or should be – to all humans, regardless of the characteristics or traits which comprise their personal identity or situation. Their humanity does not change based on their identity. Humanity is determined by one thing – membership in the Homo sapiens species.

The ERA is an issue about equality among all humans, about the universal application of human rights, and about bodily autonomy, labelled a "fundamental human right" by the United Nations. The UN writes, "Bodily autonomy means my body is for me; my body is my own." How can someone have the right to bodily autonomy if legislation tells them what to do with their own body? "My body is my own."
