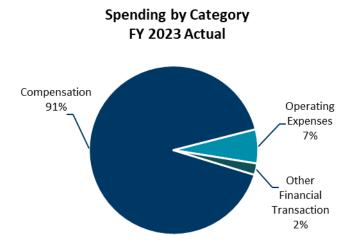
- The Minnesota Board of Private Detective and Protective Agent Services (MNPDB) regulates approximately 400 private detective and protective agent license holders.

PURPOSE

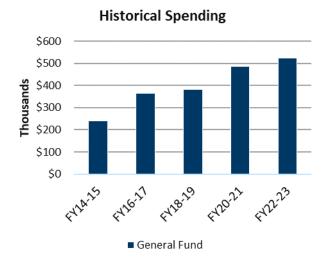
The mission of the Private Detective and Protective Agent Services Board (MNPDB) is to ensure that investigative and security service license holders meet and maintain statutory qualifications, standards, and requirements. This includes meeting criteria in criminal background checks, educational requirements, proof of financial responsibility, and ensuring that license holders are acting responsibly and in the best interest of their clients.

With public safety and consumer protection as primary goals, the agency investigates complaints against license holders and violations of statutes. It also provides support to law enforcement and the courts regarding unlicensed activity and police impersonation and works towards increasing the quality of the industry.

STRATEGIES

Streamlining Procedures: MNPDB has implemented several initiatives to process applications, renewals, complaints, officer changes, training certifications, and data privacy requests more quickly. These include the executive director approving training and instructors within 48 to 72 hours of receipt, simplifying and revising forms, revising the license renewal process, conducting data practice reviews, engaging in the retention schedule and holding only required material, and working with license holders to resolve issues before going to the board. MNPDB is implementing an electronic record management system, and it continuously reviews and revises its own processes to increase efficiency.

Website Revision: MNPDB is part of the Department of Public Safety's new website implementation. This will increase customer's ease of use in locating specific information, and it allows the board to add additional pertinent details and guidance.

Complaints, Investigations, and Audits: License holders and non-licensed security agencies, along with certified training courses, are audited and investigated by MNPDB. The agency investigates all complaints and processes them as instructed by the board.

Recommendation:

The Governor recommends additional funding of \$8 thousand in FY 2026 and \$17 thousand in each subsequent year from the general fund to help address operating cost increases at the Board of Private Detective and Protective Agent Services.

Rationale/Background:

The cost of operations rises each year due to increases in employer-paid health care contributions, FICA and Medicare, along with other salary and compensation-related costs. Other operating costs, like rent and lease, fuel and utilities, and IT and legal services also grow. This cost growth puts pressure on agency operating budgets that remain flat year to year. This recommendation provides additional resources to help address these cost pressures and pay for agency operations.

Agencies face challenging decisions to manage these rising costs within existing budgets, while maintaining the services Minnesotans expect. From year to year, agencies find ways to become more efficient with existing resources. For FY 2026-27, agencies will need to continue to find additional efficiencies and leverage management tools to help address budget pressures. Holding open vacancies in certain programs or delaying hiring in other programs are examples of ways agencies manage through constrained operating budgets. Such decisions are difficult and must be weighed against a program's ability to conduct business with less staffing and its impact to service delivery.

Proposal:

The Governor recommends increasing agency operating budgets to support current services. For the Board of Private Detective and Protective Agent Services, this funding will help cover expected growth in employee compensation and insurance, and other operating costs.

Results:

This recommendation is intended to help the Board of Private Detective and Protective Agent Services address rising cost pressures and mitigate impacts to current levels of service and information to the public.
