Subject Service-Learning

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Overview

This bill establishes a service-learning specialist position at the Department of Education and a grant program for schools to provide students service-learning opportunities.

Summary

Section Description

Service-learning specialist; service-learning work. [Service-learning and work-based learning curriculum and programs]

Requires the commissioner of education to create a service-learning specialist position in the department to expand evidence-based service-learning, coordinate grants, and provide technical assistance to schools and their partners. Allows the commissioner to provide or contract for specialized expertise in service-learning best practices, professional development, research, or development.

- 2 Innovative incubator service-learning grants.
 - **Subd. 1. Definitions.** Defines terms.
 - **Subd. 2. Establishment; eligibility criteria; application requirements.** Establishes a five-year technical assistance and grant program to support service-learning opportunities. Requires an eligible school to employ specified staff to develop and implement service-learning best practices and work with students. Establishes requirements for receiving a grant.
 - **Subd. 3. Innovation grants.** Requires the commissioner to award up to 32 grants of up to \$50,000 each year for eligible partnerships to provide student-designed, student-led service-learning opportunities.
 - **Subd. 4. Evaluation.** Requires the commissioner to evaluate grants based on the educational and developmental outcomes of participating students and the school's progress toward meeting world's best workforce goals or goals under

the state Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) plan. Requires the commissioner to report to the legislature.

3 **Appropriation.**

Appropriates \$300,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$300,000 in fiscal year 2025 for the service-learning specialist at the department; and \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2025 for service-learning grants.



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
