Dear Chair Liebling and Members of the Committee:

Minnesota's Prenatal to Three Coalition (PN-3) requests your support for HF 660. The PN-3 Coalition advocates for equitable state policies to support strong families and give children the best start in life and we believe HF 660 provides important resources and training that can save lives. Unfortunately, in Minnesota maternal death rates are 2-3 times higher for Black, American-born African American women and Indigenous women, regardless of income and education.¹

The Minnesota's Department of Health recently completed their Maternal and Child Health needs as part of the federal Title V funding. A key finding was to improve culturally responsive care to women and families.² The needs assessment acknowledges that culture plays a huge role in how women and families define health and how they interact with the health care system.

Increasing diversity and knowledge of providers through training and data collection is an important strategy to mitigate these deadly inequities and we ask for your support of HF 660.
