Bill Description

The proposed legislation would require the Department of Corrections (DOC) to submit an annual performance report to the members of the legislative committees and divisions with jurisdiction over public safety policy and finance. It would require the DOC to maintain statistics related to the supervision of extended jurisdiction juveniles and include those statistics in the agency's annual performance report.

Assumptions

The DOC currently prepares and submits a biennial performance report to the Legislature. The provisions of this bill would shift that from a biennial requirement to an annual requirement.

The most recent biennial performance report took approximately 160 staff hours to complete. The change to an annual report would require at least 160 hours of staff time every other year (average of 80 hours per year), and would be completed as part of the ongoing responsibilities of the DOC's planning and performance unit. The cost would be minimal (less than .04 FTE) but the accumulative effect could be significant as additional reporting requirements are enacted.

Application changes to the DOC's portal would be necessary to comply with the reporting requirements established in section 241.016, subdivision 1, paragraph (c) of this bill, related to statistics for extended jurisdiction juveniles.

The estimated cost to modify and maintain the application would be \$55,000 in FY2022, with ongoing costs of \$9,000 in FY2023 and each subsequent year. The additional time to include the new reporting requirements in the annual report would be minimal.

There are no criminal charges in this bill.

There would be no impact to prison beds or supervision caseloads statewide.

An effective date is not specified, but it is assumed this bill would be effective July 1, 2021.
