Bill Description

This bill directs the commissioner of health to work in cooperation with local units of government to develop a plan for monitoring water quality at public beaches and issuing public health notices and beach closures, when warranted. The commissioner must submit a plan, including any policy and funding recommendation, to the legislature by January 15, 2021. The bill has a blank one-time general fund appropriation.

Assumptions

Since the department has only one full-time equivalent (FTE) staff currently working in its beach monitoring program, the department will need and additional FTE staff epidemiologist for six months to coordinate the development and write-up of the plan.

Developing the plan will require the epidemiologist to travel around the state and meet with stakeholders to obtain input from local units of government. The epidemiologist will also research and coordinate best practices throughout the county and analyze the data collected.
