Bill Description

This bill enacts section 62A.3095, which requires that all health plans providing coverage to Minnesota residents (as defined by 62A.011, subdivision 3) covers refills for prescription eye drops upon request, if the request is made within specified time periods, and the prescribing practitioner indicates on the original prescription that additional quantities would be needed. The total number of refills that will be covered is subject to a limit.

The bill does not contain an appropriation.

Assumptions

We assume that this bill will require our quality assurance auditors to revise their audit tools and file review worksheets to accommodate the new provisions. Auditors will also have to inform plans of additional requirements. This work will occur only in the first year. Also in the first year, auditors will have to be more rigorous in their examination of plan procedures. These first-year requirements are estimated to take one auditor one half hour. After the first year, auditors will have to review these provisions in each health plan's policies and procedures during quality assurance audits and review pharmacy utilization management denials files for additional provisions. These new requirements result in a infidecimal amount of additional staff time.

We assume that during the first year, our existing health plan analyst will have to review plans for all HMOs and CBPs to ensure that they have made any modifications necessary to comply with the bill. We estimate that this will take approximately 5 hours and a infidecimal amount of additional staff time over the course of the year.

We do not anticipate receiving many complaints as a result of this bill. A small number of complaints, however, will not result in measureable change in workload.

We assume that implementing this bill will not require any time from management or administrative support beyond regular duties.

Bill Description

This legislation changes health plan coverage requirements for prescription eye drops.

Assumptions

The bill applies new coverage requirements for prescription eye drop refills. Specifically, the bill prohibits health plans from denying coverage for prescription eye drop refills when the request is received from a pharmacy between 21 and 30 days from the last refill for a 30 day supply or between 75 and 90 days from the last refill for a 90 day supply.

This new requirement may change the intervals between prescription eye drop refills and impact the timing of provider payments between pharmacies and health plans serving Medical Assistance or MinnesotaCare program recipients. This change is limited to prescription eye drops and is not expected to change overall utilization. This fiscal note assumes no impact to health plan capitation rates paid by DHS to its contracted health plans.

Bill Description

HF1203 would modify when refills can be requested at a retail pharmacy or by mail order for certain types of prescription eye drops.

Assumptions

MMB administers the State Employee Group Insurance Program (SEGIP) which provides health, dental, life and other benefits to eligible State employees and their dependents, and other groups such as quasi-state agencies under the legislative authority provided in Minnesota Statutes 43A. Health benefits are provided through the self-funded Minnesota Advantage Health Plan. SEGIP has a contract with a pharmacy benefit manager (PBM) to administer the prescription drug benefit.

The Minnesota Advantage plan currently provides prescription eye drop coverage to its members through retail pharmacies and by mail order. Prescriptions requested through retail pharmacies are available in 30 day and 90 day supplies; prescriptions requested by mail order are available with a 90 day supply. When requested through a retail pharmacy, the Advantage plan currently accepts refill requests when made between 21 and 30 days for a 30 day supply and between 68 and 90 days for a 90 day supply. When requested by mail order, a 90 day supply can be refilled between 45 and 90 days. With the Advantage plan's current prescription drug refill benefit being in compliance with the proposed legislation, MMB would not expect a financial impact.
