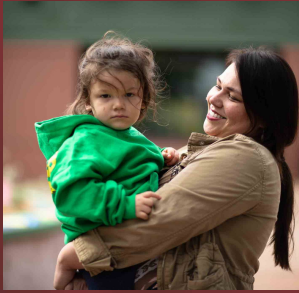

NACC's mission is to promote health & wellness of mind, body and spirit in Native American families. We value health and tradition, provide high quality care regardless of the ability to pay, and aim to increase health equity for Native American families in the Twin Cities. Everyone is welcome at the clinic and we strive to be a good relative to all.

NACC serves over 5,000 American Indian/Native American (AI/NA) patients yearly. NACC has embarked upon a major fundraising campaign to purchase and expand our clinic which will allow us to serve more patients by providing access to culturally-centered whole person care.

This campaign will ensure that NACC remains fiscally strong while moving forward with renovation and operationalization of our expanded clinic and continuing to provide quality services in an effort to meet our mission to promote and increase health equity for the Native community. This expansion will create 15 permanent livable waged jobs and promote economic growth in the community.

NACC has secured the required \$4.6 million and purchased the building we operate in for this expansion project. NACC is approaching the legislature for an additional \$2.2 million to begin the clinic expansion plans. NACC will match the \$2.2 million state investment dollar for dollar through private and philanthropic support. NACC is also working with private and public philanthropic partners to scale services into our new clinic footprint.

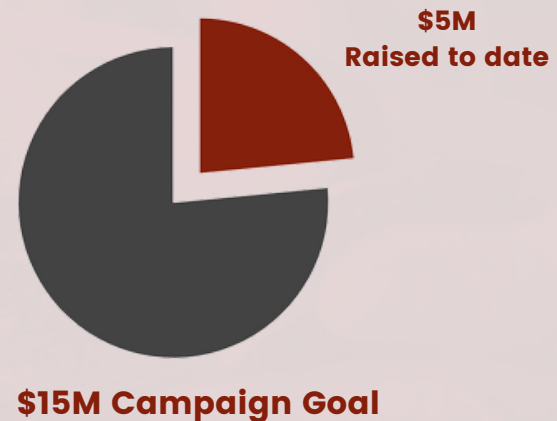

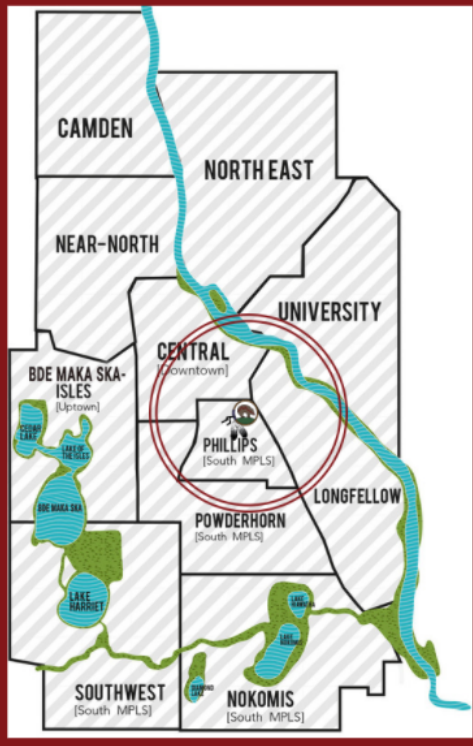

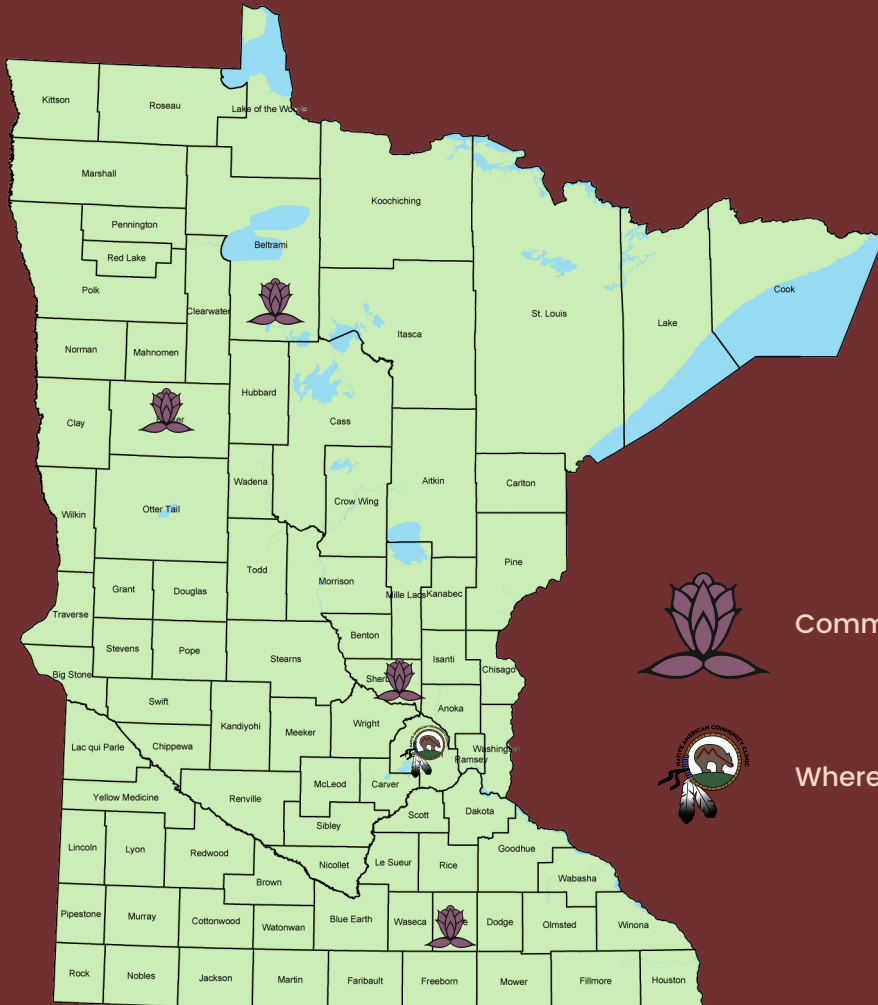




# Communities NACC Serves
