1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 122A.092, subdivision 2, is
1.9	amended to read:
1.10	Subd. 2. Requirements for board approval. Teacher preparation programs must
1.11	demonstrate the following to obtain board approval:
1.12	(1) the program has implemented a research-based, results-oriented curriculum that
1.13	focuses on the skills teachers need in order to be effective;
1.14	(2) the program provides a student teaching program;
1.15	(3) the program demonstrates effectiveness based on proficiency of graduates in
1.16	demonstrating attainment of program outcomes;
1.17	(4) the program includes a common core of teaching knowledge and skills. This common
1.18	core shall meet the standards developed by the Interstate New Teacher Assessment and
1.19	Support Consortium in its 1992 model standards for beginning teacher licensing and
