RE: Act this Special Session on Unemployment Assistance for Working High School Students

Dear State Leaders,

As the latest special session begins, we, the undersigned organizations, urge you to make sure working high school students ages 16-and-older get the money they've earned.

These students who were part of the workforce before COVID-19 and whose employers had been paying into the unemployment insurance system for them have been waiting months for unemployment benefits. It's past time for legislation to make them temporarily eligible this special session.

These students are real people who rely on their wages to support themselves and their families, paying for basic needs like food, rent, and utilities. For many of them, access to unemployment assistance is about survival.

Because of a 1939 state law, thousands of hard working high school students who lost their jobs because of COVID-19 are denied access to state unemployment insurance and federal support through Pandemic Unemployment Assistance.

Minnesota is one of the only states in the country where high school students are not eligible for either state or federal benefits. As a result, many students face the prospect of dropping out of high school or not getting the benefits they've earned. When young people are forced to drop out, it jeopardizes the future of their education and their ability to participate in the economy.

Some students were even granted benefits by the state incorrectly and now are in debt because the state is demanding the money back.

Legislators from both parties are working on legislation to provide temporary access to this assistance for high school students ages 16 and older through the end of the year.

We urge you to support this legislation to help fuel our state's recovery from this pandemic.
