1.5	from the general fund to the commissioner of labor and industry for a grant to a cooperative
1.6	unit under Minnesota Statutes, section 123A.24, subdivision 2, to establish a statewide
1.7	registered apprenticeship program for teachers and a joint apprenticeship training committee.
1.8	This is a onetime appropriation.
1.9	(b) Funding must be used to develop or implement a registered apprenticeship program
1.10	with the following five components:
1.11	(1) involvement by school districts or cooperative units to ensure apprentices develop
1.12	the skills needed to be effective teachers;
1.13	(2) structured on-the-job training from an experienced mentor;
1.14	(3) related instruction from a teacher training program approved by the Professional
1.15	Educator Licensing and Standards Board;
1.16	(4) increases in wages for participants as they gain higher skill levels; and
1.17	(5) a sequence of training and instruction resulting in a Tier 3 license issued by the
