GMPT is a non-profit membership organization made up of more than 125 cities, counties, non-profits, a tribal nation, and businesses who support parks and trails located outside the metropolitan area. Our members strive to provide quality local and regional recreational opportunities for all Minnesotans throughout the state.

Whether state, regional or local, Minnesota has some of the best parks and trails in the United States. Access to those parks and trails plays an important role in Minnesota being consistently ranked as one of the healthiest states in the country. Our parks and trails also play an important role in our state's economic development.

The challenge we face now is a common one throughout the country. Childhood obesity is on the rise. Opportunities for indoor recreation, such as video games, are increasing exponentially. That's why it is so important that our children spend time outside and in nature. If children develop a love for spending time outdoors when they are young, that will continue through the rest of their lives.
