As of Monday, February 25, 2019, the following bills are hereby referred to the **Long-Term Care Finance and Policy Division**.

HF168 (Schultz) Relating to Human Services, modifying the disability waiver rate system.

HF178 (Halverson) Relating to Human Services, modifying the operating payment rate for certain nonprofit

HF258 (Lien) Relating to Human Services, modifying the operating payment rate for certain nonprofit nursing facilities in border cities.

HF425 (Petersburg) Care facilities for persons with developmental disabilities rate increase provided.

HF763 (Loeffler) Medical assistance excess income standard for persons who are elderly, blind or have disabilities increase phased in.

HF765 (Loeffler) Medical assistance excess income standard for persons who are elderly, blind, or have disabilities increased.

HF1045 (Loeffler) Medical assistance income limit for elderly, blind, or disabled persons increased.

HF1046 (Loeffler) Medical assistance income limit for elderly, blind, or disabled persons increase phased in.

HF1099 (Halverson) Appropriating money for grants to certain day training and habilitation providers.

HF1298 (Considine) Personal care service providers minimum wage provided, and money appropriated.

HF1565 (Lippert) Long-Term Care Ombudsmen Office funding provided, and money appropriated.
