1.11 **pain.** (a) When used for the treatment of acute dental pain or acute pain associated with
1.12 refractive surgery, prescriptions for opiate or narcotic pain relievers listed in Schedules II
1.13 through IV of section 152.02 shall not exceed a four-day supply. The quantity prescribed
1.14 shall be consistent with the dosage listed in the professional labeling for the drug that has
1.15 been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration.

1.16 (b) For the purposes of this subdivision, "acute pain" means pain resulting from disease,
1.17 accidental or intentional trauma, surgery, or another cause, that the practitioner reasonably
1.18 expects to last only a short period of time. Acute pain does not include chronic pain or pain
1.19 being treated as part of cancer care, palliative care, or hospice or other end-of-life care.

1.20 (c) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), if in the professional clinical judgment of a practitioner
1.21 more than a four-day supply of a prescription listed in Schedules II through IV of section
1.22 152.02 is required to treat a patient's acute pain, the practitioner may issue a prescription
1.23 for the quantity needed to treat such acute pain.

2.1 (d) Pharmacists and pharmacies shall not be subject to disciplinary action or other civil
2.2 or criminal liability of any kind for dispensing or refusing to dispense medications pursuant
2.3 to an otherwise valid prescription that exceeds the quantity limits specified in this
