

Subject Medication repository

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Overview

This bill clarifies that the medication repository must maintain a record of destruction of accepted donated drugs and supplies that are not dispensed or are subject to recall. It also expands the allowable uses of fiscal year 2026 and 2027 appropriations to the Board of Pharmacy for the medication repository.
