1.2 Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

1.3 "Section 1. LEGISLATIVE REPORT ON TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION  
1.4 AVAILABILITY.

1.5 (a) By February 15, 2020, the commissioner of transportation must submit a report on  
1.6 Department of Transportation reporting and public information availability to the members  
1.7 and staff of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over transportation policy and  
1.8 finance.

1.9 (b) As part of analysis and development of recommendations in the report, the  
1.10 commissioner must at a minimum:

1.11 (1) consult with and take into account comments from interested stakeholders, which  
1.12 must at least include:

1.13 (i) two representatives each from the house of representatives majority caucus and largest  
1.14 minority caucus;

1.15 (ii) two senators each from the senate majority caucus and largest minority caucus;

1.16 (iii) representatives of advocacy and public interest groups that are related at a minimum  
1.17 to public health, the environment, and the economy;

1.18 (iv) representatives of persons with disabilities including from the Transportation  
1.19 Accessibility Advisory Committee under Minnesota Statutes, section 473.375, subdivision  
1.20 9a;

1.21 (v) representatives from each of the ethnic councils under Minnesota Statutes, section  
1.22 15.0145;

1.23 (vi) representatives from traditionally underrepresented or underserved populations;

- 2.1 (vii) representatives of labor and industry related to transportation projects;
- 2.2 (viii) representatives for each transportation mode including highways, transit, bicycling,
- 2.3 and pedestrian;
- 2.4 (ix) representatives from the advisory committee on nonmotorized transportation under
- 2.5 Minnesota Statutes, section 174.37;
- 2.6 (x) representatives from state agencies, local units of government, and tribal nations;
- 2.7 and
- 2.8 (xi) members of the general public;
- 2.9 (2) evaluate the utility, necessity, and format of the reports;
- 2.10 (3) identify informational gaps in the reports, including analysis of effective methods
- 2.11 to communicate the information;
- 2.12 (4) examine identical or similar information from the reports as available in alternative
- 2.13 formats, including on the department's website;
- 2.14 (5) analyze information available in planning documents created by the department in
- 2.15 compliance with state and federal law, including review of the format and ease of use for
- 2.16 the legislature and the general public; and
- 2.17 (6) take into account administrative costs of creating each report.
- 2.18 (c) The report must summarize the work of the department and stakeholder input and
- 2.19 must provide a legislative proposal that identifies any legislative reports, as required of the
- 2.20 commissioner by law, for which to repeal, change the frequency of submission, or otherwise
- 2.21 modify. The commissioner may include recommendations for changes in law regarding
- 2.22 transportation planning that comply with applicable federal requirements.
- 2.23 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."
