Chair Hassan and Members of the House Economic Development Finance and Policy Committee:

I am writing to express my significant concerns with Article 4 in HF 3028, the Omnibus Economic Development Finance Budget Bill. The existence of these provisions only came to my attention late last night as this committee had not been the venue for PFA-related policy discussions so far this session.

Article 4 would make major policy changes to the Public Facilities Authority's (PFA's) Clean Water and Drinking Water Revolving Funds (CWRF/DWRF) and concerningly, reduce long-term lending capacity. The PFA's CWRF and DWRF revolving loan funds are the State's largest and most cost-effective source of funding for water infrastructure projects for cities of all sizes throughout the State. To date, every \$1 in state matching funds has generated over \$15 in project construction, and the below-market interest rates provide millions in annual interest savings to cities and their residents. Over the past five years, PFA low-interest loans have totaled over \$1 billion, including \$709 million for 122 clean water (wastewater) projects and \$301 million for 117 drinking water projects. In addition to loans, federal law allows a portion of annual federal capitalization funds to be provided as principal forgiveness grants based on affordability criteria for disadvantaged communities and for energy efficiency improvements and green infrastructure projects. Under current state statutes, affordability criteria established for the PFA's Water Infrastructure Fund (WIF) program are also used for federal principal forgiveness grants. WIF affordability criteria are based on an analysis of the per household cost for operation, maintenance, and debt service within each city's wastewater or drinking water enterprise fund. Grants tend to go to smaller cities that have fewer users to share the costs, providing critical assistance for projects to rehabilitate and replace aging infrastructure that would otherwise be unaffordable.

A major factor in the success of the CWRF/DWRF loan funds is the stability of the funding process which allows cities to have confidence in the availability of low interest financing as they plan and prepare for their projects. Taking principal forgiveness grants from federal loan capitalization funds permanently removes those assets from the revolving loan funds, thereby reducing long-term lending capacity. PFA is required under federal law to maintain the CWRF and DWRF in perpetuity. To maintain the strength and stability of the revolving loan funds, the use of principal forgiveness grants must be limited and carefully targeted to achieve a specific purpose or outcome, such as reducing user rates or incentivizing cities to address specific types of water infrastructure needs.

Article 4 would establish new definitions for affordability and disadvantaged communities that would replace the current affordability criteria with demographic and census tract data. PFA and its

partner agencies recognize that additional federal funding through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) provides an opportunity to expand the use of federal principal forgiveness grants for a broader range of cities and projects to address important environmental justice and equity issues. But we object to wholesale changes that would totally replace existing criteria with overly complicated metrics that do not provide a workable basis for targeting principal forgiveness grants.

The 2023 Clean Water and Drinking Water Project Priority Lists contain \$4.6 billion in project needs over the next 5-10 years, and long-term needs surveys estimate \$12 billion in needs over the next 20 years. The American Society of Civil Engineers 2022 Infrastructure Report Card gives Minnesota a C and C- for wastewater and drinking water. To meet our long-term water infrastructure needs, Minnesota must efficiently and effectively use available resources by carefully managing the revolving loan funds and targeting limited state and federal principal forgiveness grants to achieve clear and specific outcomes.

We have been working in good faith with Capital Investment Chair Lee to develop additional affordability and disadvantaged community criteria that could be added to the CWRF and DWRF programs, while maintaining the strength and stability of the revolving loan funds. I would welcome the opportunity for additional dialogue at the committee or with individual members going forward.
