Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council Recommendations — FY2020

LSOHC Recommendations Highlights

In the eleventh year of Outdoor Heritage Funding (OHF), the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council is recommending a total of 44 programs be funded by the MN Legislature for a total of \$127,505,000.

- 141,218 acres of wildlife habitat throughout Minnesota is estimated to be restored, enhanced, and/or protected.
- 152 miles of shoreline will be restored, enhanced and/or protected.
- An additional \$30,727,300 in federal, state, and private conservation funding is expected to be leveraged with FY2020 OHF.
- 27 different organizations are recommended for funding (1 national park, 2 state agencies, 9 local units of government, and 15 non-government organizations).
- Continued investment in robust on-going programs constitutes 73% of the programs recommended.
- Activities include: native prairie protection, wetland restoration, trout stream enhancement, public wildlife land enhancements, shallow lake enhancement, forest fragmentation prevention, strategic land acquisition in fee and conservation easement.




Constitutional Amendment - Article XI—Sec. 15.


...33 percent of the receipts shall be deposited in the outdoor heritage fund and may be spent only to restore, protect, and enhance wetlands, prairies, forests, and habitat for fish, game, and wildlife;...

...The dedicated money under this section must supplement traditional sources of funding for these purposes and may not be used as a substitute. Land acquired by fee with money deposited in the outdoor heritage fund under this section must be open to the public taking of fish and game during the open season unless otherwise provided by law...






Output by FUNDING






