Overview

H.F. 1057 creates a framework for preK-12 education grants awarded by the legislature, encourages the goals of the grants to be aligned to Minnesota's world's best workforce and the federal government's student accountability systems, and requires all grant recipients to report on their activities.

Requires each grant recipient, within 180 days of the conclusion of the grant period, to report to the commissioner and the legislature on the effectiveness of the strategies used to meet the purposes of the grant through an evidence-based evaluation of the program.

Requires all preK-12 education grants awarded after July 1, 2022, to be awarded through a framework that encourages the goals of the grants to be aligned to Minnesota's world's best workforce and the federal government's student accountability systems. Requires grant recipients to use evidence-based practices and report on their activities to the commissioner of education and the legislature.
