

Why Safe Routes to School?

- 1. Fewer kids today walk and bike to school
- This has resulted in unintended consequences
- 3. SRTS programs can be part of the solution

Decreased activity leads to more overweight and obese children



A Vision for Minnesota

Youth in Minnesota can safely, confidently, and conveniently walk, bike, and roll to school and in daily life.



Comprehensive Safe Routes to School Programs

SRTS planning supports communities in developing a comprehensive approach that includes:

Engagement



Meaningfully engaging with the community to understand barriers and address relevant needs

Evaluation



Student or parent surveys, traffic crash data

Equity



Identifying schools with greatest need, making activities and materials accessible to all

Education



Bike Rodeos, Walk! Bike! Fun!, classroom activities

Encouragement



Walk and Bike to School Days, Walking School Bus

Engineering



Improvements to streets, trails and sidewalks to improve walking and biking conditions

Stats on SRTS in MN

- Over \$50 million spent since 2006 on SRTS projects statewide
- 471 projects have been funded, affecting an estimated 1,704 schools
- Almost \$44 million went to infrastructure projects, with 70% outside of Metro
- Rank 3rd best Safe Routes to School program in the nation

- 2017 and 2018 bonding provided \$2 million in SRTS infrastructure





Figure 1: 2006-2019 State and Federal SRTS Projects

SRTS Infrastructure 2020 Funding

- October, 2020 bonding bill provided \$3 million for SRTS infrastructure
- Fall 2021 solicitation to coincide with federal Transportation Alternatives solicitation
