

CASWELL REGIONAL SPORTING COMPLEX PHASE II BONDING REQUEST - \$10 MILLION











This is Phase II of a project funded by the legislature in 2020 which included enhancements to the original softball facility at the original complex. The City of North Mankato has completed the construction documents necessary for the project and is ready to proceed immediately following appropriation. The City requests \$10 million in state bonding dollars to fund the construction of a fieldhouse. The City proposes to match the State bonding request with \$12.2 million of local option sales with tax dollars approved by voters in 2016 and other necessary local funds.







