Bill Description

This bill makes a small change in scope of covered services for Community Emergency Medical Technicians (CEMTs) under the Medical Assistance (MA) program by allowing post nursing facility discharge visits to include checking and recording vital signs and providing patient reminders.

Assumptions

Legislation passed in 2016 established MA coverage for certain services performed by Community Emergency Medical Technicians (CEMT) in the Medical Assistance (MA) program. Current covered services for people discharged from the hospital include verbal or visual reminders of discharge orders, recording and reporting of vital signs, medication and food access confirmation, and identification of home hazards. CEMTs may also provide home safety evaluations for people discharged from a nursing facility. This legislation aligns the scope of coverage for post nursing home and post hospital discharge visits by clarifying that post nursing facility discharge visits may also include checking and recording vital signs and providing patient reminders.

Under current law CEMT services are reimbursed at \$9.75 per 15 minute increment of service. The fiscal note for the 2016 legislation assumed that the provider billing for safety checks for a nursing facility post discharge visit and the post discharge hospital visits would include two units of service paid at the rate of \$9.75 per unit. The assumption of two units of service was based on the protocol for the CEMT pilot project with North Memorial Hospital which included patient reminders and the taking of vital signs. The current MA forecast already assumes that CEMTs will bill an average of two units of service, and clarifying that CEMTs may take patient vital signs and provide patient reminders will not have a further fiscal impact on the MA program.
