RE: HF 3072 (clean air for kids in cars)

Dear Chair Hornstein and Committee Members:

Minnesotans for a Smoke-Free Generation is a coalition of more than 60 organizations working to reduce youth tobacco use and end tobacco's harm for good. **Minnesotans for a Smoke-Free Generation supports HF 3072,** which protects youth from secondhand smoke and e-cigarette aerosol exposure in vehicles.

Research finds that average secondhand smoke exposure in a car is equivalent to sitting for three hours in a smoke-filled room. As a state, we have made significant progress to protect our kids and all residents from the harms of secondhand smoke and aerosol. Just last year, the Minnesota Legislature voted overwhelmingly to strengthen our state's clean indoor air act by including e-cigarette aerosol.

Unfortunately, those same protections haven't reached our cars. One study found that <u>nearly 23 percent of Minnesota kids rode in a smoky vehicle at least once in the past week</u>. That is far too many kids who are exposed to deadly secondhand smoke.

Our kids are counting on us to extend Minnesota's clean air protections from bars and restaurants into our cars. By passing this law, Minnesota can join nine other states that protect children from being exposed to dangerous secondhand smoke while riding in a vehicle.

This bill would prohibit smoking – including e-cigarette use – in a vehicle when children under 18 are present. At a time when our state is facing a youth tobacco epidemic and rising vaping rates, this bill also sends a clear message to kids that no tobacco use is safe.

This proposal is overwhelmingly popular among Minnesota voters. A recent poll found <u>88 percent of Minnesotans support prohibiting smoking and e-cigarette use in cars when kids are present.</u>

On behalf of Minnesotans for a Smoke-Free Generation, thank you for considering this important policy to protect our kids from the harms of e-cigarette aerosol and secondhand smoke. We hope we can count on your support.
