Bill Description

This legislation modifies Minnesota Statutes by authorizing lifetime game and fish license information to be placed on a drivers license (DL) or Minnesota identification card (ID). The Driver and Vehicle Services Division (DVS) fiscal note addresses modifications to MS 171.07.

Assumptions

Assumes implementation date of August 1, 2016.

Assumes the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) will electronically transmit the required lifetime license holder information to DVS.

Assumes that without the DL/ID number included in the transmitted information it is a highly likely records cannot be correctly matched.

Assumes one-time vendor costs of \$100,000 to modify current license format to accommodate additional information.

Assumes DNR will provide DVS with abbreviations for each category of life-time license.

Assumes DNR license number is 11 characters.

Assumes a maximum of 20 characters are available for use on a DL/ID in which to include lifetime, category of license(s) and license number(s).

Assumes outside contractor one-time programming costs to the legacy system of \$385,950 (planning 515 hrs, design 644 hrs, build 1,029 hrs, deployment/testing 385 hrs).

Assumes if IT resources dedicated to decommissioning the legacy system in preparation for MNLARS are diverted to these program modifications it could delay the October 2016 Phase 1 Motor Vehicle timeline for MNLARS implementation.

Assume if effective date is delayed until Phase 2 Driver Services MNLARS replaces existing systems (2018) costs could be absorbed by DVS.

Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula

Special Revenue fund expenditures:

Programming costs 2,573 hrs x 150/hr = 385,950

DL/ID formatting change cost \$100,000

Long-Term Fiscal Considerations

The DVS budget is fee-based and must cover the cost of business through fees collected. Any increase in expenses may require increasing fees.

Bill Description

This bill proposes a file transfer of lifetime license holders be sent to the Dept. of Public Safety so this designation can be placed on a drivers license.

Assumptions

This proposal places a lifetime license designation on a drivers license. It does not preclude the license holder from meeting other requirements. This designation on a drivers license will not be used by Enforcement as an instrument to ensure compliance. M.S. 518A.68 allows suspension or bar receipt of obligors recreational license if not in compliance with court-ordered child support or maintenance payments.

An individual will still need to meet lifetime license requirements:

- ·firearms safety certificate, present a drivers license or an identification number
- ·license validation (only valid during lawful time of the license year)
- ·apply for permits, select hunting season (if applicable, i.e. deer), type of license (firearm or muzzleloader), purchase of stamps
- registration and tag issuance
- ·HIP certification
- ·Respond to survey information at time of license request
- ·Respond to Walk-In Access or Walleye account donation opportunities.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service issues a federal apportionment to states by a formula. This calculation is based on certified license holders and land mass. The formula varies based on the program. The Wildlife and Sport Fish Restoration Acts, under U.S. Fish and Wildlife control, require the department to complete an annual certification of paid hunting license holders and paid fishing license holders. This is also known as Pittman/Robertson Dingell/Johnson

(PR/DJ). License validations are counted when there is at least \$1 net revenue. As of 2014, the est. federal earnings are \$17.17 per hunting license and \$3.37 per fishing license.

When a lifetime license holder performs a validation, the department performs an annual transfer of funds from the lifetime trust fund to the appropriate licensing accounts. This ensures the department has collected net revenues of \$1 and ensures the lifetime license holder is alive to be counted in the annual certification.

As of now, there are an estimated 36,500 lifetime license holders. An average of 3,200 lifetime licenses is sold each year.

If implemented, MN.IT staff would provide programming for an initial file transfer containing all current lifetime license holders (est. cost \$3,200 one-time), and monthly file transfers thereafter. (deminimus).
