Bill Description

This bill requires the Commissioner of Human Services to apply for federal grant money that could be used to create and implement opioid awareness and abuse prevention programs for high school students and undergraduate students in Minnesota high schools and postsecondary educational institutions.

The grants would be directed to schools and community partners who would actually be the applicants and managers of any grant funds received. Grants must include one or more of the following components as they relate to opioid abuse and prevention and the role of the community partner: high-risk populations, law enforcement, education, clinical services, or social services, and at least one proposal that addresses opioid abuse in the American Indian Community.

The bill directs the commissioner to report to the chairs and ranking minority members on the implementation of the grant program and the grants awarded by September 1, 2019. It also directs the commissioner to report any grant applications submitted and federal actions taken related to the grant applications.

Assumptions

The work to identify the source of federal grant funding and to apply for it would be absorbed by the Alcohol and Drug Abuse division. If awarded a grant, administrative funds would support staffing to administer the grant, and to complete a report for the legislature.
