## **Overview**

School districts provide a variety of services to students who have an individualized education program. Some of these services are health-related. Minnesota's statutes and rules allow some health-related services for these students to be charged by the schools to the health care systems through a process commonly referred to as third-party billing.

H.F. 945, notwithstanding Minnesota Rules, part 9505.0371, explicitly allows third-party billing for health-related school social work services. In order for these services provided by social workers to be reimbursable, the bill requires the school social worker to: (1) hold a master's degree in social work; (2) be licensed by the Board of Social Work; (3) be licensed by the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board as a school social worker; and (4) currently hold an independent clinical social worker license issued by the Board of Social Work or hold a graduate social worker or independent social worker license and working under the supervision of a licensed independent clinical social worker.
