Bill Description

The bill establishes a small cities assistance program, to provide new state transportation funding for cities that are not eligible for municipal street aid. Each eligible citys distribution is based on each eligible citys population and miles of municipal streets. The Department of Revenue (DOR) shall be notified by the Department of Transportation (DOT) of the allocation of funds made available by law, and DOR shall distribute the funds to cities in the same manner as local government aid under Chapter 477A.

Assumptions

DORs Property Tax Division will be responsible for making the payments to eligible cities, based on the information provided by DOT. Since DOR already makes several payments to cities, the administrative impact on DOR is anticipated to be minimal and DOR does not expect to incur administrative costs or savings as a result of this proposal.

Bill Description

House File 1450-1E would establish a program to provide assistance to small cities for construction and maintenance of roads and bridges, and would create an account in the Special Revenue Fund. Eligible cities would be limited to those that do not receive transportation funding from municipal state aid under Minnesota Statutes 162.09-14 (basically cities with populations under 5,000). In years where funding is available, MnDOT would determine the allocation between eligible cities based on population (50%) and lane miles (50%). MnDOT would then notify the Minnesota Department of Revenue (DOR), who would be responsible for actually distributing the funds.

Funds provided in this account would be exempt from the state aid requirements in M.S. Chapter 162, including but not limited to engineering standards. This bill would be effective July 1, 2015.

Assumptions

These funds would be exempt from state aid requirements and would be distributed outside of the normal state aid processes. The only potential additional effort would be to estimate the allocation by city in years where funding was made available. The necessary data is readily available, so these efforts would be minimal. No fiscal impact is shown.

The bill would also make any appropriation to MnDOT available to DOR for distribution purposes. Any costs from this bill for DOR will be included in their fiscal note.
