Dear Representatives of the Government Finance Committee,

Please vote NO on HF314.

This bill is a prime example of the government trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist and furthermore attempting to eliminate an option to mitigate potential conflicts in the future. Please stop while you're ahead.

Of particular issue are lines 1.11 through 1.13, stating: "The legislature may not delegate its duty to draw districts to any commission, council, panel, or other entity that is not comprised solely of members of the legislature."

Just so I'm clear about my understanding of this line in particular: you want to draw the lines for the districts you represent and specifically outlaw potentially letting any external non-partisan group participate. Really? I heard the logic for this was so that individuals could vote out their representative if they don't like how the districts are drawn. Is this seriously true? This is like, the first step in "how to gerrymander your district". (Even if "that's not the intent", it smells VERY bad.)

If you know that there is an area that you are not particularly strong with in your district, what stops you from nudging the lines a little bit to adjust for that? Please don't tell me Subdivision 9 about Incumbents covers it. It does make it against the rules, but to prove the rule was broken someone has to then be taken to court, and that's not free (claimant OR defendant). It is a barrier of protection that basically makes Subdivision 9 worthless in practice. Subdivision 4 regarding Contiguity and Compactness is subjective at best when looking at potential gerrymandering.

Additionally, I am disappointed that, in a bill about redistricting written within the last three months, there is nothing about setting a standard based on The Efficiency Gap. (I have included links below for your reference.) We as a state have not needed to incorporate such a measure into our system, as we have maintained reasonable levels of district equality - but maybe that's because we never let the legislature do it in the first place.

Finally, my greatest concern is bias for one party over another. If you're the team in charge that may not seem like a big deal, but it is. It's as much about making sure we are always arguing over the middle as it is about making sure that we're not arguing over whose extreme is better. If we do start to see districts that unevenly favor one party over another, the politicians within those districts will have to start fighting further and further to the extreme of the party to win a seat. We've seen the destruction this has had a national level. I want to continue to believe that we are too rational of a state to enter into behavior that would lead us down that same path.

The MN Supreme Court has done a fine job for our state (drawing district lines) as evidenced by our low party bias. We've got a good thing going; let's not mess that up.
