

1.1 Liebling and Scott from the Committee on Judiciary Finance and Civil Law to which
1.2 was referred:

1.3 H. F. No. 3893, A bill for an act relating to health occupations; regulating use of artificial
1.4 intelligence in psychotherapy services; providing for civil penalties; proposing coding for
1.5 new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 214.

1.6 Reported the same back with the following amendments:

1.7 Page 1, line 15, after "reminders" insert ", performed by the licensed professional, by
1.8 an employee of the licensed professional, or by a business associate according to a business
1.9 associate agreement. For purposes of this clause, "business associate" has the meaning given
1.10 in Code of Federal Regulations, title 45, section 160.103"

1.11 Page 5, line 19, after "section" insert "by a licensed professional; determine whether a
1.12 licensed professional violated this section; and impose appropriate disciplinary action" and
1.13 after the period insert "Nothing in this section limits the duty of a health-related licensing
1.14 board to regulate licensed professionals in a manner that protects the health, safety, and
1.15 welfare of people in Minnesota."

1.16 With the recommendation that when so amended the bill be re-referred to the Committee
1.17 on Commerce Finance and Policy.
