Drinking Water | Wastewater | Storm & Sewer Improvements



The City of Russell has faced **multiple watermain breaks** over the past year, leading to the closure of entire city blocks for repairs. One of their watermains is made of **asbestos pipe**, which poses significant health risks if it breaks or leaks. Additionally, the city has experienced frequent **sanitary sewer backups**, with **homeowners reporting wastewater in their basements**. The main sewer lift station, an open-pit design, experienced a major issue in 2017 when an overflow discharge of **13,000 gallons of wastewater soaked into the ground**.

Funds Needed

Phase 1 Project Scope

Phase 1 utility work totaled \$9.8 million and was completed fall of 2024. It has been funded and includes:

- New main lift station
- New 50,000 Gallon Water Tower
- Installation of PVC watermain, gate valves, hydrants, and a new storm sewer pipe
- Rehabilitating three existing lift stations
- Street restoration all streets that are affected by utility replacement.

Phase 2 Project Scope

Phase 2 utility work will total \$13.1 million and will begin once funding is secured. This project includes:

- Addition of watermain looping to eliminate stagnant water- PPL Rank 578
- New water valves for safer maintenance
- Improvements to sewer collection system to help eliminate infiltration and inflow- PPL Rank 578
- Addition of storm pond & improvements to remaining streets, sidewalks, curb and gutter, and driveways

Project Affordability

- The population of Russell is 348.
- Median household income is \$56,094, and 25.8% of children in Russell live in poverty.
- As part of this project, the city will establish a reserve/replacement account.
- Current monthly utility costs in Russell average \$100/month and could increase an additional \$104/month without bonding assistance.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. **RUSSELL; WATER INFRASTRUCTURE AND STREET**
RECONSTRUCTION.

Subdivision 1. Appropriation. \$4,000,000 is appropriated from the bond proceeds fund
19 to the Public Facilities Authority for a grant to the city of Russell to design, construct, and
110 equip the replacement of aging and failing municipal infrastructure. This appropriation
111 includes money for improvements to and replacement of a water distribution system, a
112 sanitary sewer system, and storm sewer system infrastructure, and reconstruction of city
113 streets.

Subd. 2. Bond sale. To provide the money appropriated in this section from the bond
proceeds fund, the commissioner of management and budget shall sell and issue bonds of
116 the state in an amount up to \$4,000,000 in the manner, upon the terms, and with the effect
117 prescribed by Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.631 to 16A.675, and by the Minnesota
118 Constitution, article XI, sections 4 to 7.

Dear Representative Swedzinski,

The City of Russell is taking steps to apply for funding from the State of Minnesota to help fund infrastructure improvements to their drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater systems.

The improvements to the drinking water system include a looping water main to help eliminate stagnant water within the distribution system. New valves will also be added to allow for easier shutdown during maintenance, eliminating disruptions to non-impacted areas of the city. An existing water main is an asbestos pipe, which is extremely dangerous if it were to break or leak.

The improvements to the wastewater system will extend the sanitary sewer collection system to include the two new housing developments and will repair sections of the collection system that are failing. There have been sanitary sewer backups in homes all throughout the city over the years that have resulted in some homeowners having wastewater in their basements. In 2017, 13,000 gallons of wastewater overflowed and soaked into the ground.

The stormwater system would add a new pond by the new water tower and be used for an industrial park area and allow for stormwater storage and detention time. Other ponding issues around the city will also be addressed.

Lyon-Lincoln Electric Cooperative serves the City of Russell with electric energy and proudly counts the citizens of Russell as cooperative members. Our mission is not only to provide reliable electricity, but also other needed services to enhance the quality of life in our rural communities. We believe this project and the benefits they will provide will help do just that. Therefore, we support the City of Russell in this application.

My name is Kim Hook and I have been a daycare provider here in Russell for almost 30 years.


